Head Lice

During the February break it would be an ideal time to check your child's hair for head lice.

These are **very** small, six legged wingless insects, pin-head size when hatched, usually grey/brown in colour.

Not all children scratch and feel itchy, so please take some time to comb through your child's hair to check.
